Volunteers—Here are the steps to take:

Once the volunteer is in his/her/family ZSuite account and has selected his/her profile follow the steps below:

1. Click on Clover Academy on the left menu bar
2. Launch Clover Academy
3. Open NM Working with Minors (even though it says completed)
4. Under 'You have earned a certificate' is a button that says [Reset All Course Progress for New Year (Cannot be undone.)
5. Click on the blue 'Reset All Course Progress for the New Year (Cannot be undone)
6. Start Course

Complete the course and a certificate will be available with the completion date. Sandoval County 4-H ZSuite administrators (Steve, Elizabeth) should be able to see the volunteer completion on our county page.

Just a reminder, as stated above, all of us that work directly with youth (agents, staff, program assistants, etc) need to take the working with minors training annually.



Take 10 with 4-H (Zoom) Leader Idea/Information Sharing for 4-H Volunteer Leaders

An extension agent or 4-H volunteer presents about 5-7 minutes on a topic and opens up the conversation for sharing from participants for the remainder of the 10 minutes. Sessions are recorded and shared on the State 4-H Website. 4-H Name and Emblem Use Handbook

The 4-H Name and Emblem is a federal mark, protected by Public Law 18 U.S.C. 707, and is entrusted by Congress to the Secretary of Agriculture, with authorized use by 4-H clubs across the nation, the representatives of USDA, land-grant institutions, and persons authorized by the Secretary of Agriculture.

Within the 4-H Name and Emblem rules and regulations, its use extends to the National 4-H Council, supporting national and state 4-H programs through cause-marketing, fundraising, brand management, communications, and legal and fiduciary services.

Guidelines ensure that the authorization and use of the 4-H Name and Emblem remains consistent and appropriate. These guidelines protect the treasured 4-H Name and Emblem, and ensure that authorized use benefits and supports the 4-H Youth Development Program, aligns with the principles of 4-H positive youth development, and does not hurt the image of 4-H by association. Community Service Scholarships for SLR

The New Mexico 4-H Community Service Scholarship deadline for Senior Leadership Retreat (SLR) 2024 is coming up in October. The scholarship will cover the registration expenses.

This scholarship is available to any Senior 4-H Member participating in a 4-H activity. They must submit a New Mexico 4-H Community Service Scholarship application form. A revision is made to the scholarship application and a reminder regarding projects submitted. Multiple youth, including siblings cannot do the same community service project. If applications are submitted by multiple youth with the same project proposal, they will be denied. Siblings can do a community service project at the same location as long they are different projects. Applications that have community service activities through established organizations, like cleaning up trash along the highway, or just working as a volunteer for an established organization for example, will not be accepted. If the applicant would like to work with the organization in creating a new program, that is acceptable. The project must be an activity that the youth designs, organizes and implements that will have an impact on the community.

Scholarship Information

A Scholarship fund has been established by the 4-H County Council to provide financial assistance to 4-H members that wish to attend State, District, or County 4-H events. Scholarship will cover 50% of the registration expenses for Senior Leadership Retreat, Youth-Get-Away, Livestock School, Horse School, Home Ec School, 4-H Dog School, or \$250 of the team fees for serving as a State 4-H Officer, Ambassador, or a Diplomat. The scholarship will cover 100% of the registration expenses for 4-H County Camp. The funding may not be used to attend State 4-H Conference, State 4-H Shooting Sports Contest, nor District Contest.

Cancellations and Refunds

Cancellations and refunds are made only if road conditions in the Las Cruces vicinity are severe. Drivers must make their own travel decisions based on road conditions in their area. We do not want anybody taking unnecessary risks in order to attend this event. Refunds cannot be made unless there is a National Weather Service storm warning in existence in the Las Cruces/Dona Ana area. If a refund is made due to bad weather, there will be a surcharge deducted to cover actual program expenses incurred up to that point.. If a cancellation is made prior to the registration deadline, the participant can receive a full refund. After registration is closed, if a 4-H'er or adult who is registered cannot attend, a county can substitute another person of the same sex in his or her place, but an actual refund will not be made. If there is no one from your county to fill the spot, please let the state office know before sharing the vacant spot with counties. If a cancellation is done after registration is closed due to an emergency or current health issue a full refund will be given to the participant.

CLOVERBUD: 5 to 8, years old AND in Kindergarten, 1st or 2nd grade

NOVICE: 9 to 11 years old or 8 years old AND in the 3rd grade.

JUNIOR: 12 and 13 years old or 11 years old AND in 6th grade.

SENIOR: 14 to 18 years old or 13 years old AND in 8th grade

Youth who are 19 on or by December 31 of the current 4-H year (2023) are NOT eligible to enroll as a 4-H member.
