## 4-H Trash-To Give Back!

Step in to Serve Your Community! Adopt an area as a 4-H Service and Scholarship Project Litter cleanup, collect trash, keep roads clean . . . and more!

United Waste Services has partnered with Sandoval County 4-H again this year. Through this partnership UWS will provide the Sandoval County 4-H Council a \$5,000 check to be used as scholarship funding for 4-H members. Our responsibility is to organize litter cleanup events in our communities.

Each Sandoval County 4-H Club needs to organize a trash/litter cleanup and provide the Extension Office the following:

- 1. Date, time and location of the cleanup.
- 2. Copy of the sign-in sheet for each cleanup.
- 3. Before, during, and after pictures of the location.
- 4. The number of trash bags collected.
- 5. A group picture of the participants for each cleanup.
- 6. A brief letter from each participating club discussing what the children learned from the cleanup event with regard to litter, how they felt when the event was complete, and how they will try to prevent others from littering in the future.

The 4-H Clubs will be responsible for the site selection, ensuring proper adult/child ratios, providing safety vests for participants, and any other safety considerations. Contact Nicole or Steve for vests, bags and gloves.

### **Horse Certificates**

Horse Certificates need to be done every year or renewed every year with approval of the Sandoval County Extension Agents Steve or Nicole. The horse certificate is a form similar to a registration form. You can find it on

the 4-H website under "Forms and Publications." They are due on May 1 to the Sandoval County Extension Office (not the State 4-H Office).

Horses get sold, traded, and/or leased and this is the purpose to do them each year. This is a unique aspect to the project. Horse Certificates are required for any sanctioned 4-H horse show. The only way that the agent can verify that the horse being used is the project horse, is for a 4-H member to document that they are the exhibitor, leasee, or owner of that particular horse.

Sandoval County 4-H requires that members in the rodeo project submit horse certificates. It is strongly recommended that 4-H members submit a horse certificate for any horse that they may use as their project for the year.

### 4-H Horse School

4-H Horse School is scheduled for June 2022, pending State and University health regulations.

The event is usually held at the New Mexico State
Fairgrounds in Albuquerque. In the coming months we will let you know the date, place and cost.





### 2-Year-Old Western Pleasure Futurity and 3-Year-Old Versatility Nominations

4-H'ers with advanced skills in horsemanship are eligible to nominate a two year-old horse for the Western Pleasure Futurity and Showmanship Classic held each year during the State Fair 4-H Horse Show.

Nominations are due in the State 4-H Office by May 1.

Horses eligible for the two-year-old Western Pleasure Futurity must be totally green, that is, having never received any riding by ANYONE other than the 4-H'er who nominates the horse to the Futurity. During the State 4-H Fair Horse Show, the horses will participate in three go-rounds of Western Pleasure.

The horses properly nominated as two-year-olds to the Futurity are eligible the following year to enter the three-year-old Versatility Class. Advice and counsel on training techniques may come from outside sources, however, the 4-H member must do all the riding and work on the Versatility Horse.

The Versatility Class is held during the State Fair 4-H Horse Show. Nominations for the Versatility Class are due to the State 4-H Office by May 1 of the current year. Nomination forms and complete rules are available on the 4-H website under "Horse and Livestock Events." There is a \$20.00 nomination fee.

### 4-H MEMBERSHIP AGE DIVISIONS

4-H programming in New Mexico addresses the needs and interests of young people. Any boy or girl age 5 through 18 years of age, who enrolls in the 4-H Youth Development Program of the Cooperative Extension Service is a 4-H member. The 4-H program year is October 1 through September 30.

The following guidelines address specific age requirements for the 4-H program:



## **DEADLINE for enrollment is March 1, 2022.**

- 1. When online completing your enrollment online, once you get to the Waiver Data page, click the tab "DOWNLOAD NEW MEXICO 4-H YOUTH MEDICAL AND LIABILITY RELEASE/CODE OF CONDUCT"
- 2. Print forms, complete and Sign, Scan and SAVE in pdf. Then you upload Completed Form—there is a tab provided for that.
- 3. Then, Enter your name that you agree to the "above" release and date. We need to see the actual medical release.
- 4. If you uploaded correctly there will be a black paperclip to the left. Also make sure that you hit the submit button after any and all changes. If you have any questions, please email Nicole and Steve at sandoval@nmsu.edu.

### New Mexico 4-H Shooting Sports Leader Certification

This online portion is available through Zing-books at a cost of \$20.00.

The Shooting Sports State Championships is for Senior age members. The current rules can be found on the State 4-H website under the Shooting Sports tab.

### **NM State 4-H Portfolios**

Youth wishing to submit for the trip to Congress will need to have their book compiled and to the County Extension Office in time for them to be mailed to the State 4-H Office with a postmark of February 1, 2022.



Books will be evaluated and trips awarded for the 2022 National 4-H Congress. Winners will be recognized by March 1, 2022.

We encourage our <u>Senior</u> 4-H members to submit a State Portfolio. Below is an outline of the acceptable formats. Forms and detailed instructions are available on the State 4-H Website. State 4-H Record Book Outline:

- 1) Must contain a cover page with photo of youth, name, age, club and county
- 2) Must contain a State 4-H Resume as outlined in the 4-H Portfolio Guidelines
- 3) Must be cumulative showing records for all the years a youth has participated in 4-H.
- 4) This can be done in a variety of ways:
  - a) Layer county record books in a large binder with a divider between each year
    - include no more than three projects per year (they may have less, but not more) and keep projects consistent across years.
  - b) Utilize the current State 4-H Portfolio format with profiles that summarize your 4-H career in each section and project record sheets for the project





### **Scholarship Information**

A Scholarship fund has been established by the 4-H County Council to provide financial assistance to 4-H members that wish to attend State, District, or County 4-H events. Scholarship will cover 50% of the registration expenses for Senior Leadership Retreat, Youth-Get-Away, Livestock School, Horse School, Home Ec School, 4-H Dog School, or \$250 of the team fees for serving as a State 4-H Officer, Ambassador, or a Diplomat. The scholarship will cover 100% of the registration expenses for 4-H County Camp. The funding may not be used to attend State 4-H Conference, State 4-H Shooting Sports Contest, nor District Contest. **Scholarship Criteria**—Available to any Novice, Junior or Senior 4-H Member.
