



RODEO — GENERAL RULES FOR CONTESTANTS – RULE #2



All contestants must have personal accident insurance and a signed, completed Consent and Assumption of Risk Form. Form must be in the State 4-H Office by May 1st of the current year for the member to compete in Sanctioned 4-H rodeos.

This includes the completion of the rodeo safety videos https://aces.nmsu.edu/4h/4-h-rodeo.html

In the event a Sanctioned rodeo occurs prior to May 1st, contestants must have personal accident insurance, a signed and completed Consent and Assumption of Risk Form, as well as a completed safety course, turned into the State 4-H Office 15 days prior to that rodeo. No personal accident insurance or signed and completed Consent and Assumption of Risk Forms will be accepted in the State 4-H Office after May 1st of the current year.

Scholarship Information

A Scholarship fund has been established by the 4-H County Council to provide financial assistance to 4-H members that wish to attend State, District, or County 4-H events. Scholarship will cover 50% of the registration expenses for Senior Leadership Retreat, Youth-Get-Away, Livestock School, Horse School, Home Ec School, 4-H Dog School, or \$250 of the team fees for serving as a State 4-H Officer, Ambassador, or a Diplomat. The scholarship will cover 100% of the registration expenses for 4-H County Camp. The funding may not be used to attend State 4-H Conference, State 4-H Shooting Sports Contest, nor District Contest. **Scholarship Criteria**—Available to any Novice, Junior or Senior 4-H Member.


