

# GENERAL LIVESTOCK RULES

(Revised-March 2009)

The **GENERAL** Rules of the Sandoval County Fair apply except as otherwise stated below. These **SPECIAL** Rules take precedence over all other rules.

1. Entry need to be post marked or received at the 4-H Office **no later** than 4:00 PM one week prior (Thursday) to the Fair. Late small animal entries will be accepted, but only be eligible to exhibit in the Open Shows.
2. Entry fees will be charged as follows:
  - Market Steers \$10.00
  - Breeding Beef \$10.00
  - Dairy Heifers \$10.00
  - Market Sheep & Swine \$ 8.00
  - Breeding Sheep & Swine \$ 5.00
  - Goats \$ 5.00
  - Poultry & Rabbits (per head) \$ 1.00
  - Market Meat Pens (Poultry & Rabbits) \$ 3.00
3. **Exhibitors are limited to show only 2 animals per category (Beef, Sheep, Goat, Swine). Extra animals may be shown in the open classes. Exhibitor must declare class (meat or breeding) at check-in.**
4. Animals will be allowed to weigh only once. There will be absolutely no re-weighs. Any animal not meeting the weight requirements will be sifted.

Market calves will be classified by hip method or by weight. Weight 900 lbs. — minimum.

**Market lamb weights: Southdowns — Minimum 50 lbs. — no maximum.**

**All other Classes — Minimum 100 lbs. — no maximum**

**Market hog weights: Minimum 210 lbs. — maximum 270 lbs.**

**Market goat weights: There is no minimum or maximum weight. The goats will be classed by weight for show.**

A 3% weight slack will be given on the top and bottom of all large animals' weights.

5. All animals must have appropriate identification (tags, markings, tattoos) and inspection papers and/or health papers. Exhibitor will be required to show them at check in time with the livestock. **Exhibitors are responsible for retaining original documents if the animal is not going to be sold or if it is to be shown at another contest, i.e.: State Fair.** (Call 4-H Agent for more information).
6. The following are deemed unethical practices: Doctoring, doping, or injecting show animals for body “fill-ins”, or the alteration, changing, defacing or any modification of the markings of show animals and the anatomical structure of any animal; the removal, alteration, changing, or purposely damaging of ear tags; or any type of injection where oils, glycerin, or like substances are used for body “fill-ins”; external applications of such things as liniments and blistering agents that would cause an edematous condition. The use of any device that would be considered cruel or inhumane to animals, such as the use of hot shots, shall be forbidden. Any exhibitor found guilty of any of the above listed unethical practices, or any other practice deemed unethical by the Superintendent/Livestock Board/Livestock Sale Committee/Veterinarian will forfeit all premium monies and sale money. If any, over packer’s bid and the owner of the animals as well as the represented school or 4-H Club will be barred from future participation until such time as reinstatement is made by the Superintendent/Livestock Board and state sanitation regulation will apply.
7. The exhibitor must furnish display cases, cages, feed, and other necessary equipment.
8. ***ALL exhibitors need to wear a long sleeved buttoned shirt preferably white and clean jeans. Shirt must be tucked into pants. Exhibitor must wear belt. Native American and other traditional dress is allowed. No hats or other head dress is allowed.***
9. Boys and girls who are not enrolled in 4-H are eligible to exhibit in the open classes. This is to encourage them to enter 4-H projects or when they become of age.
10. 4-H division all animals shall be shown by their owner. No exception will be made unless owner has a valid reason acceptable to the Superintendent and/or Livestock Rules Committee and arrangements have been made before the event.

11. If an exhibitor has more than one entry per class, a substitute of the same age group, qualified exhibitor may be used. Substitutes are limited to participants who are entered in other projects in the fair (4-H members in current standing with entries in the fair). In no case may a parent, agent or advisor present any animal for classification or judging.
12. All animals presented for exhibition shall be free of disease. If not they shall be removed immediately to a place of quarantine as designated by Superintendent.
13. 4-H livestock and small animals shall be checked-in and in their assigned pens by 4:00 PM Thursday.
14. All 4-H division livestock shall be properly groomed and fitted for showing. Failure to do so will result in disqualification. **You need to bring your own grooming tools and equipment with you or have it done before the day of the Fair.**
15. Any animal causing disturbance or undue delay in the judging will be disqualified at the Superintendents/Livestock Committee's discretion.
16. No portable panels allowed except when no stall space is available. Exceptions must be approved by Superintendent.
17. **All animals at all times must be kept thoroughly groomed and clean.** Stalls and pens must be kept neat and supplied with clean bedding. Pathways and approaches must be kept clean for the convenience of spectators.
18. In the case where no rule applies to cover a situation, the Livestock Committee shall make a rule and define its application to such a situation. Such decisions will be final. All protests must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of \$25 (certified check or cash), which will be forfeited if the protest is not sustained. Any protest must state plainly the cause of the complaint or appeal and must be delivered to the Livestock Superintendent within 24 hours after the occasion of such protest. (This applies to all departments.)
19. Adult and youth open livestock breeders are encouraged to exhibit their livestock at the County Fair — on stall space available basis. If interested, check with the Superintendent/Livestock Sales Committee.

## **4-H JUNIOR LIVESTOCK SALE RULES**

1. Large animals eligible to sell are: Market Steers, Market Lambs, Market Hogs, and Meat Goat/Cabritos exhibited in the “Junior Division”. All animals eligible to sell will be sold through the junior livestock sale unless the exhibitor notifies the Superintendent of the department to the contrary not later than 30 minutes following the conclusion of the steer show. Breeding Stock are not eligible for the Sale.
2. Small animals eligible to sell are: Grand Champion/Reserve Champion rabbit and poultry meat pens and Grand Champion/Reserve Champion rabbit and poultry. **All animals eligible to sell will be sold through the junior livestock sale unless the exhibitor notifies the Superintendent of the department to the contrary not later than 30 minutes following the conclusion of the steer show.**
3. There will be 49 animals allowed to sell at the Junior Livestock Sale. The 49 animals will be made up of 8 market steers, 11 market hogs, 11 market lambs, 11 meat goats, 2 pens of 3 meat rabbits, 2 pens of 3 meat poultry, 1 Grand Champion and 1 Reserve Champion Rabbit and Poultry, respectively. If buyers are available after the 49 animals have been sold, 4-H's who have not sold an animal, will be allowed to sell one (1) animal only. Meat and breeding small animals will be allowed to sell in this sale, no breeding large animals will be allowed. Additional animals may be sold at private treaty, exhibitor must notify Superintendent of such sale.
4. The sale order will be prepared Friday at the conclusion of the show by the Superintendent and the Livestock/Sale Committee. In the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sale, animals will sell by placing within species. Species will sell in this order: steers, swine, lambs, goats, rabbits, poultry. Exhibitors selling in the 2<sup>nd</sup> sale must notify Superintendent which animal will be in this 2<sup>nd</sup> sale within 2 hours of posting of the 1<sup>st</sup> sale order.
5. Exhibitors may sell up to 2 animals in the sale if they qualify (Placing 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, or 3<sup>rd</sup> in each class) and are not in the same category (Beef, Sheep, Goat, Swine). When Grand Champion or Reserve Champion is selected from a class or an animal is pulled from sale, all other placings within the class are adjusted accordingly. Not all animals will make the sale. There will be no limit to the number permitted to sell at packer's bid.  
**No soliciting of bids by exhibitors will be allowed during the Livestock Sale.**

6. A packer's bid will be obtained and announced at the sale. **(Packer bids may not be available for Hogs.)**
7. Exhibitors are responsible for the care/feeding of their animals, until the buyer/packer takes possession (on the truck) after the sale or on Sunday at noon. All other livestock are not released until Sunday at noon.
8. ALL GLITTER, GLUE, ADHESIVES, ETC. MUST BE REMOVED FROM ALL SALE ANIMALS AFTER THE SALE, PRIOR TO SHIPMENT.
9. A 3% commission fee will automatically be deducted from each of the sales.
10. If the packer docks the price on an animal because of weight or any other undesirable characteristics, this will be passed on to the exhibitor sending the animal to the packer.
11. Official sale weight for animals going through the sale is weigh-in weight for show.
12. Should an animal which has been sold die before it is loaded the sale monies will be refunded to the buyer and the exhibitor will suffer the loss.
13. Any exhibitor having an animal entered in the sale is prohibited from seeking special privileges from buyers such as seeking permission to re-purchase the animal. The 4-H animal becomes the property of the buyer to do with as they wish. **Do not expect to get your animal back!** You will also be required to write and send out thank you letters to your buyers and add-on's. Letters must be forwarded to Extension Office prior to receiving your premium money.

**UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE**  
**WHOLESOME MEAT ACT**

The United States Department of Agriculture Wholesome Meat Act applies to the sale of market livestock sold during the Sandoval County Fair as follows:

1. Animals must be in good health and carcasses free of drug or chemical residues.
2. Antibiotics and sulfonamides have required withdrawal periods.
3. Drug label directions for use and withdrawal periods must be followed.
4. If drug or other chemical residues are found in tissue carcasses, the entire carcass may be condemned.

If drug or other chemical residues are found in tissue of carcasses of animals sold through the sale, said show will in no way be liable or responsible for condition of carcass or sale price of animal. Any cost incurred by the Sandoval County Fair for the testing of any suspect animals will be the responsibility of the exhibitor. Exhibitor forfeits premium awards and all rights to sale price.

### **JUNIOR STEERS/BREEDING**

1. Entry fee: \$10.00 per head.
2. Beef Cattle must have been owned and managed by the exhibitor for a period of at least 5 months (March 1<sup>st</sup>), prior to the fair date. Extension Agent shall tag animals on "tag-in date".
3. **Proof of ownership must be furnished at tag-in. A bill of sale, ownership brand, 4-H brand will be required as ownership proof.**
4. Weight for market steers: They will be classified by the weight method. Weight – 900 lbs. minimum – no sale animals weight will be listed above 1300 lbs. An exhibitor can only be paid up to 1300 lbs.
5. Any class having less than seven head may be combined with another class. The Superintendent reserves the right to combine or delete to suit the need.
6. All steers will be judged during the livestock show. If there is only one class of steers, then the first place steers is the Grand Champion Steer, the second place steer is the Reserve Grand Champion Steer.
7. General Livestock and Jr. Livestock Sale Rules apply.

## STEER SHOWMANSHIP

1. Showmanship Age Groups:
  - a. Novice: 9 to 11
  - b. Junior: 12 to 13
  - c. Senior: 14 to 19
2. To be eligible for the Steer Showmanship competition, the steer being shown must also have been shown in the appropriate Steer Class. Exhibitor must own the animal.
3. **The judge of each show will judge all showmanship classes. Showmanship will be judged as a separate class at the conclusion of the livestock show.**

Criteria for judging is as follows:

- Care and fitting of the animal
- Showmanship ability of exhibitor
- Training
- Conduct in show ring
- ***ALL exhibitors need to wear a long sleeved buttoned shirt preferably white, and clean jeans. Shirt must be tucked into pants. Exhibitor must wear belt. Native American and other traditional dress is allowed. No hats or other head dress is allowed.***

## JUNIOR SHEEP DIVISION

1. Entry Fee: \$8.00 per head (market) \$5.00 per head (breeding)
2. Sheep must have been owned and managed by the exhibitor for a period of at least 3 months (May 1<sup>st</sup>), prior to Fair date. The extension agent shall tag animals on “tag-in date”.
3. **Proof of ownership must be furnished at tag-in.**
4. **Weight for wether or ewe lambs:**
  - a. **Southdown — minimum weight 50 lbs. — no maximum.**
  - b. **All other classes — minimum weight 100 lbs. — no maximum.**

5. Lambs must have their lamb teeth at weigh-in.
6. No lamb halters will be allowed in the show ring with the exception of Fine Wool Classes. The use of a halter will disqualify exhibitor from Showmanship.
7. Any class having less than seven head maybe combined with another class. The Superintendent reserves the right to combine or delete classes to suit the need.
8. All market lambs must be slick shorn with a uniform fleece no longer than ¼ inch by show time. Lambs in each division will be divided into weight classes based on number of lambs in each division and the weight of the lamb.
9. There will be a CHAMPION AND RESERVE CHAMPION from all market lambs classes.
10. Wethers or ewe lambs maybe shown in the market lamb class.
11. General Livestock and Jr. Livestock Sale Rules apply.

### **SHEEP SHOWMANSHIP**

1. Showmanship Age Groups:
  - a. Novice: 9 to 11
  - b. Juniors: 12 to 13
  - c. Seniors: 14 to 19
2. To be eligible for the Sheep Showmanship competition, the sheep being shown must also have been shown in the appropriate Sheep Class. Exhibitor must own the animal.
3. **The judge of each show will judge all showmanship classes. Showmanship will be judged as a separate class at the conclusion of the livestock show.**

Criteria for judging is as follows:

- Care and fitting of the animal
- Showmanship ability of exhibitor
- Training
- Conduct in show ring

- ***ALL exhibitors need to wear a long sleeved buttoned shirt preferably white, and clean jeans. Shirt must be tucked into pants. Exhibitor must wear belt. Native American and other traditional dress is allowed. No hats or other head dress is allowed.***

### **JUNIOR SWINE DIVISION**

1. Entry Fee: \$8.00 per head (market) \$5.00 per head (breeding)
2. Swine must have been owned and managed by the exhibitor for a period of 3 months (May 1<sup>st</sup>), prior to Fair date. Extension agent shall tag animals on “tag-in date”.
3. **Proof of ownership must be furnished at weigh-in.**
4. **Weight for gilts and barrows Minimum 210 lbs. Maximum 270 lbs.**
5. Any class having less than seven head maybe combined with another class. The Superintendent reserves the right to combine or delete classes to suit the need.
6. There will be a CHAMPION AND RESERVE CHAMPION of all market classes.
7. Barrows or gilts maybe shown in the market hog class.
8. General Livestock and Jr. Livestock Sale Rules apply.

### **SWINE SHOWMANSHIP**

1. Showmanship Age Groups:
  - a. Novice: 9 to 11
  - b. Juniors: 12 to 13
  - c. Seniors: 14 to 19
2. To be eligible for the Swine Showmanship competition, the hog being shown must also have been shown in the appropriate Swine Class. Exhibitor must own the animal.
3. **The judge of each show will judge all showmanship classes.**

**Showmanship will be judged as a separate class at the conclusion of the livestock show.**

Criteria for judging is as follows:

- Care and fitting of the animal
- Showmanship ability of exhibitor
- Training
- Conduct in show ring

***ALL exhibitors need to wear a long sleeved buttoned shirt preferably white, and clean jeans. Shirt must be tucked into pants. Exhibitor must wear belt. Native American and other traditional dress is allowed. No hats or other head dress is allowed.***

### **JUNIOR REPLACEMENT DAIRY HEIFERS**

1. Entry fee: \$10.00 per head.
2. Dairy heifers must have been owned (or be participating in a 4-H lease program) and managed by the exhibitor for a period of at least 3 months (May 1<sup>st</sup>), prior to the fair date. Extension Agent shall tag animals on “tag-in date”.
3. **Proof of ownership must be furnished at tag-in. A bill of sale, lease contract, ownership brand, 4-H brand will be required as ownership proof.**
3. Dairy heifers will be classified by breed and age. In case that not enough heifers are shown, classes may be combined at the discretion of Superintendent.
4. All heifers will be judged during the livestock show. If there is only one class of heifers, then the first place heifer is the Grand Champion Heifer, the second place heifer is the Reserve Grand Champion Heifer.
5. General Livestock and Jr. Livestock Sale Rules apply.

## DAIRY SHOWMANSHIP

1. Showmanship Age Groups:
  - a. Novice: 9 to 11
  - b. Junior: 12 to 13
  - c. Senior: 14 to 19
2. To be eligible for the Dairy Showmanship competition, the heifer being shown must also have been shown in the appropriate Dairy Class.
3. **The judge of each show will judge all showmanship classes. Showmanship will be judged as a separate class at the conclusion of the livestock show.**

Criteria for judging is as follows:

- Care and fitting of the animal
- Showmanship ability of exhibitor
- Training
- Conduct in show ring
- Exhibitor's dress (**Require white long sleeve shirt and clean jeans or dairy colors**). **No hats or head dress allowed.**

## DAIRY GOATS DIVISION

1. Entry Fee: \$5.00 per head.
2. Animals entered in the "4-H Dairy Goat Show" are not required to be registered with the American Dairy Goat Association.
3. Dairy goats must have been owned and managed by the exhibitor for a period of at least 3 months (May 1<sup>st</sup>), prior to Fair date. Exceptions – refer to #6.
4. Ear or tail web tattoos will be checked and **must** correspond with tattoos recorded on day of tagging. Animals without tattoos will be tattooed on day **of tagging**.
5. All animals must be disbudded or dehorned and have no scurs over 1-1/2 inch in length.

6. All dairy goats must be declared in writing and tattoos recorded on day of tagging. Any exhibitor who wishes to show a doe that has not been born by day of tagging must register no later than July 19, and declare the dam on that day. As soon as she can be tattooed contact the 4-H Agent to record tattoos. It is not necessary for the does to be present on day of tagging unless they need to be tattooed. Declaration should include the classes being entered.
7. Any class having less than seven head may be combined with another class. The Superintendent reserves the right to combine or delete classes to suit the need.
8. There will be a CHAMPION AND RESERVE CHAMPION of all dairy classes. All dairy goats will be judged during the livestock show.
9. General Livestock and Jr. Livestock Sale Rules apply.

### **DAIRY GOAT SHOWMANSHIP**

1. Showmanship Age Groups:
  - a. Novice: 9 to 11
  - b. Juniors: 12 to 13
  - c. Seniors: 14 to 19
2. To be eligible for the Dairy Goat Showmanship competition, the goat being shown must also have been shown in the appropriate Dairy Goat Class. Exhibitor must own the animal.
3. **The judge of each show will judge all showmanship classes. Showmanship will be judged as a separate class at the conclusion of the livestock show.**

Criteria for judging is as follows:

- Care and fitting of the animal
- Showmanship ability of exhibitor
- Training
- Conduct in show ring
- Exhibitor's dress (**Require white long sleeve shirt and clean jeans or dairy colors**).

## **MEAT GOAT DIVISION**

1. Entry Fee: \$5.00 per head.
2. Meat goats must have been owned and managed by the exhibitor for a period of 3 months (May 1<sup>st</sup>), prior to Fair date. The Extension Agent shall tattoo and tag animals on tag-in date.
3. Proof of ownership must be furnished at tag-in.
4. All male meat goats must be wethered (castrated or elastrated). Does may be shown in this class.
5. All meat goats will be groomed for show with no more first ½ inch of hair, except pygmy goats and cabritos (Angora Cross).
6. Meat goats will be judged for meat quality.
7. Horns: Exhibitors will be required to have horns tipped on all goats prior to arrival to the fairgrounds. Dehorning acceptable.
8. Age: No breaking of skin or eruption of either of two permanent front teeth. Milk teeth must be in place.
9. All meat goats must have collars to be shown.  
  
10. Classes for meat goat are Light Weight, Medium Weight and Heavy Weight. Pygmy goats and Cabritos will be a separate class.
11. Any class having less than seven head may be combined with another class. The Superintendent reserves the right to combine or delete classes to suit the need.
12. There will be a CHAMPION AND RESERVE CHAMPION of all meat classes. All meat goats will be judged during the livestock show.
13. Any meat goats having visible signs of cysts, abscessing or any other diseases will not be received.
14. General Livestock and Jr. Livestock Sale Rules apply.

## MEAT GOAT SHOWMANSHIP

1. Showmanship Age Groups:
  - a. Novice: 9 to 11
  - b. Juniors: 12 to 13
  - c. Seniors: 14 to 19
2. To be eligible for the Goat Showmanship competition, the goat being shown must also have been shown in the appropriate Goat Class. Exhibitor must own the animal.
3. **The judge of each show will judge all showmanship classes. Showmanship will be judged as a separate class at the conclusion of the livestock show.**

Criteria for Judging is as follows:

- Care and Fitting of animal
- Showmanship ability of exhibitor
- Training
- Conduct in the show area
- ***ALL exhibitors need to wear a long sleeved buttoned shirt preferably white, and clean jeans. Shirt must be tucked into pants. Exhibitor must wear belt. Native American and other traditional dress is allowed. No hats or other head dress is allowed.***

## JUNIOR RABBIT DIVISION

1. Entry Fee: \$1.00 per head.  
\$3.00 per meat pen
2. All rabbits must have been owned and managed by exhibitor for a period of not less than 12 weeks. Meat pens must be less than **70** days old and weigh no more than 5 lbs. each.
3. Classes as follows:
  - Doe
  - Buck
  - Breeding pair
  - Fur
  - Meat - Pen of 3
  - Doe and Litter

4. Rabbits must be tattooed and recorded. Tattoos will be checked and must correspond with tattoos recorded on registration. The date of birth must be written on the entry form.
5. Classification will be done by breed, weight and age. They will be judged according to the ARBA standards per breed. A fur class will also be judged accordingly and the rabbit must be entered in its regular class.
6. Classes may be added, dropped, or combined by the Superintendent, depending on the need and number of animals.
7. All exhibitors must provide feed and water cans for their rabbits and must wire them in place. The exhibitor must complete the initial feeding and watering before leaving the barn. (No paper or Styrofoam cups will be allowed in rabbit cages or pens).
8. Any rabbit that shows signs disease, infection or parasites will not be accepted.
9. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to get their rabbits to the show table.
10. The Superintendent or Livestock Committee has the authority to disqualify any exhibitor of violations of any show rules, or if any sick or uncared-for animals are observed.
11. General Livestock and Jr. Livestock Sale Rules apply.

#### **4-H SMALL ANIMAL SHOWMANSHIP**

1. Showmanship Age Groups:
  - a. Novice: 9 to 11
  - b. Juniors: 12 to 13
  - c. Seniors: 14 to 19
2. To be eligible for the Showmanship competition, the rabbit being shown must also have been shown in the appropriate rabbit Class. Exhibitor must own the animal.

3. **The judge of each show will judge all showmanship classes. Showmanship will be judged as a separate class at the conclusion of the livestock show.**

Criteria for Judging is as follows:

- Care and fitting of animal
- Showmanship ability of exhibitor
- Training
- Conduct in the show area
  - ***ALL exhibitors need to wear a long sleeved buttoned shirt preferably white, and clean jeans. Shirt must be tucked into pants. Exhibitor must wear belt. Native American and other traditional dress is allowed. No hats or other head dress is allowed.***

### JUNIOR POULTRY DIVISION

1. Entry Fee: \$1.00 per head.  
\$3.00 per meat pen.
2. All poultry must have been owned and managed by exhibitor for a period of 70 days. Meat pens of 3 must be less than 70 days old and weigh no more than 5 lbs. each.
3. Classes as follows:

4. Classes may be added, dropped, or combined by the Superintendent, depending on the need and number of animals.
5. All exhibitors must provide feed and water cans for their birds, and you must wire them in place. (No paper or Styrofoam cups will be allowed in poultry cages or pens). The exhibitor must complete the initial feeding and watering before leaving the barn.
6. Any fowl that shows signs disease, infection or parasites will not be accepted.
7. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to get their birds to the show table.
8. The Superintendent or Livestock Committee has the authority to disqualify any exhibitor of violations of any show rules, or if any sick or uncared-for animals are observed.
9. General Livestock and Jr. Livestock Sale Rules apply.

#### **4-H SMALL ANIMAL SHOWMANSHIP**

1. Showmanship Age Groups:
  - a. Novice: 9 to 11
  - b. Juniors: 12 to 13
  - c. Seniors: 14 to 19
2. To be eligible for the Showmanship competition, the fowl being shown must also have been shown in the appropriate fowl Class. Exhibitor must own the animal.
3. **The judge of each show will judge all showmanship classes. Showmanship will be judged as a separate class at the conclusion of the livestock show.**

Criteria for Judging is as follows:

- Care and fitting of animal
- Showmanship ability of exhibitor
- Training
- Conduct in the show area
- ***ALL exhibitors need to wear a long sleeved buttoned shirt preferably white, and clean jeans. Shirt must be tucked into pants. Exhibitor must wear belt. Native American and other traditional dress is allowed. No hats or other head dress is allowed.***
