String Art Challenge

String art has been around for a while; it was popular in the 70s. Today string art is enjoying a comeback as a simple and fun way to make your own artwork. This "*retro art*" is an inexpensive way to add some personality to your walls. It's an excellent project for beginners, because it doesn't require any special skills. It isn't difficult to achieve an impressive finished product using this technique, especially if you choose a shape that has simple outlines.

The challenge is that all 4-H members build a string art to enter in the county fair. The string art has to be that of their favorite 4-H project. Each member will need to provide an Image or silhouette for outlining (see examples). Tip: Look for images and patterns that have fairly simple and straight forward outlines. Cloverbuds may participate by drawing their favorite project and coloring.

First place winners will go to the NM State Fair. Also, the county judges will select the overall winning piece and that member will win a pizza party for their club. Pizza will be provided by County Council. Materials

- The Extension office will provide the following:
- 5 ½ inch X 6 inch boards (unfinished)
- A few hammers (youth may bring their own)
- Scissors
- linoleum nails or tacks
- Colored string or embroidery floss
- Tape
- Clothespins
- Card stock paper 8 ½" x 11" (For Cloverbuds)
- Crayons or water colors (For Cloverbuds)

Instructions

- 1. Position the image (silhouette) on the wood and use tape to secure it temporarily.
- 2. With a hammer, lightly pound nails all the way around the paper pattern. Space the nails evenly and nail them to the same depth. To prevent your fingers from getting hit with the hammer, pinch each nail in a clothespin and hold *that* instead of the nail itself.



3. When the shape has been outlined completely with nails, remove the paper pattern. Using embroidery floss, outline the perimeter of the shape. Begin by tying the floss to the first nail, and leave a tail for tying off when you are finished. Use all threads of the floss to prevent the strings from breaking when you pull it taut against the nails.




4. When you reach a corner or need to change the direction of the string, wrap the string tightly around that nail. This will keep things tight and help maintain the shape.



5. Once you have outlined the shape with string, begin filling it in by crisscrossing and wrapping from nail to nail. There is no rhyme or reason to this process. Simply go from side to side; top to bottom and corner to corner, varying the lengths and order randomly. If you see that you're about to run out of string, try to end where you left a tail of string at the beginning. Knot the ends tightly and start another bundle of floss there as well. Repeat this process until the shape is filled into your liking, then tie off the end when finished. Clip the tails of thread. Now that you've finished, you write your name and club name on the back. Good luck at the County Fair and at winning a pizza party for your club!

Cain receives Cattle Growers' honor, <u>Annual Heritage showcase is back</u>

New Mexico Cattle Growers' Association (NMCGA) announced Macklee Cain of Mountainair as the 2022 recipient of NMCGA Statewide Heritage Contest during the Joint Stockmen's Convention held December 2022. Honored for her reflection and commitment to her roots in New Mexico's ranching industry, Macklee received a commemorative Torrance County Heritage belt buckle, a one year junior membership to NMCGA and a \$1,000 scholarship funded by the NMCGA Promotions and Marketing Committee.

Macklee is a fifth grade Mountainair Mustang who is active in 4-H and loves everything about ranching, **except building fence. A portion of her winning essay reads, "As a fifth generation rancher, I plan to** build on the legacy of agriculture in New Mexico by becoming an Ambassador for the ranching industry. Only 2% of the U.S. population are involved in agriculture. There are many people who do not understand how difficult feeding America is. It is my goal to educate those who are not directly involved in agriculture and show them how passionate agriculturalists are about taking care of animals and the land. I will continue to build the industry by making sure everybody knows where their meat comes from. I will show them that eating beef can be both nutritious and delicious. I will do all I can to make **sure my passion for New Mexico agriculture is contagious."**

New Mexico Cattle Growers' Association extends a congratulations to all of last year's countywide winners and is also <u>proud to announce the opening of their third annual Heritage Contest</u>. The contest **aims to tell the stories of New Mexico's youth involved in agriculture and highlights the importance of** generational ties to land and livestock.

"It's always a wonderful journey to see how excited our youth are about their futures," says Amanda Culbertson, NMCGA Promotions and Marketing Committee Chairman. "The lessons these kids learn when working alongside their fathers and grandfathers are priceless. Cattle Growers' wants to help tell the story of New Mexico agriculture and we believe this contest showcases our diverse industry and the families who make their livings at the end of the dirt road."

Youth, ages 9 to 15 years, in all 33 counties of New Mexico are eligible to apply, but previous winners will not be selected to receive honors. Entries require a 200 to 500 word essay response to the prompt: **"How would you like to continue your family's agriculture heritage to better your community?"** <u>Essay</u> <u>submission deadline is May 12, 2023</u>.

NMCGA board members, county fair board members, and award sponsors will collaborate in deciding the final winners from each county. Winners will receive a belt buckle and a one year junior membership to NMCGA. All county winners will then be automatically advanced to the Statewide Heritage Contest, where their essay submissions could earn them a \$1,000 scholarship funded through the NMCGA Promotions and Marketing Committee. The state wide winner and their family will be awarded and recognized as special guests during the 2023 Joint Stockmen's Convention.


