






Contest is open to any 4-H member, ages 9-19. Entrants do not have to be enrolled in the Photography project to enter. Entry deadline: August 1, 2025 Photos will be used to promote New Mexico 4-H.

Enter your photos to have a chance of winning the 2025 State 4-H Photo Contest.

Photos in either film or digital can be submitted through mail or Facebook by August 1st. (If picture is placed on Facebook, make sure to include the information below with the post). Photos submitted will then be placed on a link and voted on by the public. The information for the voting link will be made available on or around August 9th. The first, second and third place in each category will receive a rosette. The first place winner in each category will receive a camera case and his/her photo will automatically be entered in the contest for overall winner. The overall winner will be chosen by a set of judges and will be awarded an overall rosette and a cash prize of a \$100.

Categories -

- 4-H—Must have either correct logo or clover
- Animals Any photo that the main subject is animals
- People Any photo that the main subject is people
- Landscapes Any photo that the main subjects are fields, mountains, sunsets, lakes/rivers etc.
- Nature Any photo that the main subject is vegetation, flowers, trees, insects etc.
- Buildings Any photo that the main subject is buildings
- Other -Any photo that doesn't fall in a category, ex: road signs, mailboxes, business signs, etc.

**Entry Rules:** 

- ⇒ Members may submit up to a total of three entries. Each entry must have the following information with it—Name, Club, County, Name of Photo, Category, Location of the photo and Contact number/email.
- ⇒ Entries can be either color or black and white. Please no edited or photoshopped pictures.
- $\Rightarrow$  Please, no matted or framed photos if mailed.
- $\Rightarrow$  Photos will not be returned! If you want to keep your photo, please retain a copy.
- ⇒ Photographs must be the work of the 4-H member taken during the current 4-H program year.
- ⇒ Entries must be in the State 4-H Office or uploaded to Facebook by August 1, 2025. •

### Sandoval County 4-H Scholarship Criteria

Sponsored by Sandoval County 4-H Council

### Scholarship Information

A Scholarship fund has been established by the 4-H County Council to provide financial assistance to 4-H members that wish to attend State, District, or County 4-H events. Scholarship will cover 50% of the registration expenses for Senior Leadership Retreat, Youth-Get-Away, Livestock School, Horse School, FCS School, 4-H Dog School, or \$250 of the team fees for serving as a State 4-H Officer, Ambassador, or a Diplomat. The scholarship will cover 100% of the registration expenses for 4-H County Camp.

The funding may not be used to attend State 4-H Conference, State 4-H Shooting Sports Contest, nor District Contest.

Scholarship Criteria—Available to any Novice, Junior or Senior 4-H Member.

### State 4-H Office Community Service & Scholarship Information

If a youth is interested in attending one of the annual events and are looking for a way to assist with registration costs they can apply for the New Mexico 4-H Community Service Scholarship. The scholarship will cover the registration expenses for Senior Leadership Retreat, Youth Get-Away, Livestock School, Horse School, State 4-H Conference, 4-H International Exchange, FCS School, 4-H Dog School or \$250 of the team fees for serving as a State 4-H Officer or Ambassador.

The applicant can create their own community service or if they would like to work with an organization in creating a new program that is acceptable. The project must be an activity that the youth designs, organizes and implements that will have an impact on the community. <u>Scholarship Applications for the events are due two months before the event registration</u> <u>deadline</u>. <u>Forms must be filled out online when submitting applications</u>. The application is approved or declined by a committee. If declined, the applicant will be asked to provide further information on the proposal.

If the applicant submitted a scholarship application for an event and received the scholarship, they need to have their community service report complete and submitted to the State 4-H Office before they can apply for the community service scholarship for any future events. 
