The Food and Agriculture Sector has been deemed by the United States Government as a "Critical Infrastructure Segment" under Presidential Policy and the Department of Homeland Security.

When Congress passed the Smith-Lever Act in 1914 and created the Cooperative Extension System at USDA, it included work of various boys' and girls' clubs involved with agriculture, home economics and related subjects, which effectively nationalized the 4-H organization. By 1924, these clubs became organized as 4-H clubs, and the green clover emblem was adopted.


The Cooperative Extension System is a unique partnership of the National Institute of Food and Agriculture (NIFA) within the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA), the 109 land-grant universities (in every state and territory) and there are more than 3,000 county extension offices.

As a publicly funded, non-formal collaborative national educational network, the Cooperative Extension combines the expertise and resources of federal, state, and local governments. The Cooperative Extension is designed to meet the need for research, knowledge and educational programs that enable all people to make practical decisions.

Through the local county and state offices, Extension staff provides research-based information, non-formal educational programs and technical advice directly to individual, families and communities that enable them to be self reliant and improve their lives.

Since the Covid Virus pandemic arose, Extension offices and communications remained open across the country to aid county residents during this crisis.



Scholarship Information

A Scholarship fund has been established by the 4-H County Council to provide financial assistance to 4-H members that wish to attend State, District, or County 4-H events. Scholarship will cover 50% of the registration expenses for Senior Leadership Retreat, Youth-Get-Away, Livestock School, Horse School, Home Ec School, 4-H Dog School, or \$250 of the team fees for serving as a State 4-H Officer, Ambassador, or a Diplomat. The scholarship will cover 100% of the registration expenses for 4-H County Camp.

The funding may not be used to attend State 4-H Conference, State 4-H Shooting Sports Contest, nor District Contest.

Scholarship Criteria—Available to any Novice, Junior or Senior 4-H Member.
