NW District Contest Information

Our goal is to make this a safe and fun contest. The deadline to register for 2023 NW District Shooting Sports Contest is June 1st, 2023.

The contest will take place on June 16th starting at 9:30 am.

Changes for this year:

- 1. There will be a written test –The test will be in Formsite and the link will be email (when available) to each shooter. These tests are to be taken before coming to the district shoot, so complete and submit by June15. Formsite will automatically score the test and then the scores will be added onto their contest score. If a youth doesn't take the test, they can still shoot but will have a zero score for their test. The written test is the tie breaker and is worth 30 points.
- 2. We will run all shooting contest in one day on separate ranges. We will work with those as best we can that shoot more than one discipline.
- 3. After all the registration is complete, relays will be send out. Relays times will be set in stone.
- 4. We can't start shooting until 9:30 am and must be done by 4:00 pm.
- 5. At our Sandoval County "Shoot-out" we will need to weigh rifles and do trigger pulls before district shoot. Random weighing and trigger pulls will be conducted at district contest.
- 6. In order to allow the use of Cricket or similar type of rifles and to address safety concerns, at 2022 District Contest we will follow the NRA Rule: 3.3 Light Rifle Any .22 caliber rimfire (.22 Short, .22 Long, or .22 Long Rifle) with not less than a 2 pound trigger pull and which weighs not more than 8 ½ pounds when equipped with sights

The 2023 State 4-H Horse School will be held Monday, June 5 through Thursday, June 8, 2023 at the Socorro Rodeo & Sports Complex. Cost is \$100.

YOU MUST BE FULLY ENROLLED AND GIVE PERMISSION TO PHOTOGRAPH.

MAKE CHECK PAYABLE TO SANDOVAL COUNTY 4-H COUNCIL.

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY!

Registration will be open April 25 through May 19.

We will hand out t-shirts, nametags, and saddle tags to each participant when they arrive. Counties will be given specific stall assignments. Instructors will be located at different locations around the complex and will help you with your stall assignments and parking. When you unload your horse then go the covered arena to register.

NO APPLICATION WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER MAY 19, 2023

- 1. If a cancellation occurs after June 1 there will be a \$50 cancellation fee.
- 2. The cost will be \$100.00 per person. This fee includes stall space for one horse plus arena fees. RV/Trailer spaces \$30, located at the complex. Please contact City of Socorro Sports and Rodeo Complex 575-835-0240 or 575-838-7576 (Daryl Ross)
- 3.All applicants with horses, must have a helmet and boots with heels to ride. NOBODY is allowed on their horse unless they have them on. You must bring your own helmet and it must be ASTM certified.
- 4.Each county must have a chaperone for every eight (8) youth or fraction thereof. Designated Chaperones DO NOT
- PAY and are welcome to attend all sessions. The County Agent MUST designate the "Free County Chaperone". Any other Chaperones enrolled and screened are welcomed at no cost.
- 5. Chaperones and leaders must be enrolled and screened as per 4-H policy prior to registration.
- 6.If enough two-year old Western Pleasure Futurity horses apply by May 1, 2023, special classes will be held on training the futurity horse. If this does happen, you may bring a second horse to ride in the classes.
- 7. Participants are required to secure their own housing and meals.
- 8. The participant fee with horses covers stall space for ONE horse. The only reason to bring two will be if you are bringing a futurity horse. If you will be bringing a futurity horse, then you must put it on your application for an extra stall.
- 9.No meals will be provided.
- 10. Where applicable, you should bring Western and English tack, feed, and feed-water containers. Also, you should bring pitchforks or rakes for cleaning stalls. Split reins are required.
- 11. We do not provide horses.
- 12. No dogs will be allowed.
- 13. Horse participants must wear Western or English boots to ride. Absolutely no Tennis Shoes or type of tennis shoe (Heals Down etc.) You have to wear BOOTS! Break them in before HorseSchool.
- 14. Due to insurance restrictions, only youth enrolled in the 4-H program for 2023 may participate and who are enrolled in horse project may attend.
- 15.We do not furnish stall bedding.
- 16.You must clean your stall before leaving. As in years past you may have to help clean your stall before you can stall your horse at the beginning of the school.
- 17.Use of cell phones is prohibited during workshops, after curfew and riding sessions. PERIOD! 18.No loud music.
- 19. Participants will be sent a confirmation letter along with a list of things to bring

2023 NEW MEXICO STATE 4-H DOG SCHOOL

The 2023 New Mexico State 4-H Dog School will be held in Bernalillo County, Albuquerque, NM on June 23, 24 and 25, 2023.

What is a Dog School all about? The New Mexico State 4-H Dog School was designed to help 4-H youth become familiar with the 4-H Dog Project through the different events youth may participate in with their dogs and to promote "Responsible Dog Ownership". The three days are filled with workshops where the youth receive instruction from professional dog trainers in Obedience, Rally -Obedience, Agility, and Showmanship with their dogs. We offer different levels of learning in each event – a beginning and an intermediate/advanced. In addition, we bring in people from different organizations or groups that will demonstrate other dog events and/or occupations with dogs. The youth are given the opportunity to give a Presentation or Demonstration related to the Dog Project on Saturday night. The 4-H youth and their dog or dogs may compete in the events of Showmanship, Obedience, Rally-O and Agility.

ELIGIBILITY:

4-H Youth = 9 years old (or 8 yrs and in the 3^{rd} grade) to 18 years old as of January 1^{7} 2023.

Dog = \underline{Must} be 6 months old as of January 1' 2023. This is for the health and safety of the dog.

REGISTRATION:

Will be done On-line at your County 4-H Extension Office with your County 4-H Agent or County Extension Director. Bring a check with your registration fee, a copy of each dog's current vaccination records (rabies, parvovirus, distemper, and Bordetella), Agility release form for each dog and the NM 4-H Medical/Liability Release form with you when you register at your County 4-H Extension Office. You will not be able to bring your dog onto the grounds without current vaccinations. Please turn them in with your registration.

May we suggest that you don't wait till the last day!




