OPEN INDOOR EXHIBITS

GENERAL RULES

- 1. Any Sandoval County/Rio Puerco Basin resident is eligible to exhibit.
- 2. Articles exhibited in the fair must be the work of the exhibitor and must have been completed since the previous fair.
- 3. Each person is allowed to have three entries per class number.
- 4. All entries, including baked goods, will be taken on Monday from 10:00 am to 4:00 pm at Sandoval County Fairgrounds or any time prior at the Extension Office.
- 5. Items will be entered in the appropriate age category:
 - a. Booster 8 years and under
 - b. Youth 9-18 years' old
 - c. Adult 19 years and older
- 6. Judges will award no higher prize than exhibit merits. The decisions made by judges will be final.
- 7. No more than one of each placing may be awarded in each class.
- 8. One Best of Show (purple rosette) may be awarded in each division, within each age category, only if a blue ribbon has been awarded. Best of Show rosettes will be awarded only if deemed worthy by the judge.
- All exhibitors awarded Best of Show rosettes will be entered into a chance drawing for Outstanding Indoor Exhibitor. A
 monetary award, to be determined by Fairboard, will be awarded to each Outstanding Indoor Exhibitor in each age
 category.
- 10. The Sandoval County Fairboard and Sandoval County Cooperative Extension Service or authorized representatives thereof shall not be held responsible for damage, loss, or theft of exhibits. All items are entered at your own risk. While we do our best to handle each item carefully and respectfully, there is always some risk of damage. All items are displayed to the best of our ability.
- 11. At the close of the fair on Sunday exhibits must be claimed between 10:00 pm 2:00 pm.

Division 3 – BAKED PRODUCTS

Items need to be displayed on a white disposable plate with a plastic bag cover or plastic wrap (provided by the exhibitor). No cream pies or whipped-cream topping will be accepted for exhibit.

<u>Candy</u> should have smooth fine-grained texture—no sugar crystals. It should have a pleasing and appropriate flavor.

<u>Yeast breads</u> should be so completely baked that when pressed upon, it will spring out immediately upon release of pressure. The flavor should be agreeable to taste. The crumb should be moist, tender, yet not crumbling when compressed, light in weight in proportion to size, even grain, slightly creamy white in color. The crust of a standard loaf should be tender and of medium thickness. <u>Specialty Breads</u> should be displayed on a covered cardboard.

Quick Breads should be baked in a loaf pan no smaller than eight inches.

<u>Small cakes and cookies</u> will be judged according to uniformity in size and shape; well crowned; lightness; texture—crisp, tender even grain; and flavor—no taste of baking powder or soda, well- balanced flavor.

<u>Cakes</u> should be placed on a flat, disposable surface and will be judged on appearance, lightness, texture and flavor. In case of iced cakes, consistency and appearance of icing, as well as flavor will be considered. Items will be judged on their decoration and appearance, however, they must be edible. To be graded as excellent, a butter cake must be light in weight in proportion to ingredients used. Sponge cakes must be tender, loose in texture and velvety. Fruit cakes cannot be light, but must not be all fruit.

Division 4 – PRESERVED FOODS

Preserved products should have a label on the jar with the name of the product and the date of preservation. All canned items must be exhibited in regulation canning jars with cap and ring. No other containers will be accepted.

<u>Canned foods</u> will not be opened. Canned products will be judged according to uniform size, shape and color of the product; uniform and economical pack; clear liquid and firm solids. Air bubbles must be kept to a minimum. Headspace, method, & time must correspond to research based guidelines. The boiling water process for high-acid food and pressure process for low-acid food are the only recommended methods to preserve food in jars for shelf storage.

<u>Dried foods</u> should be shown in jars (method of drying and pre-treatment method should be indicated).

<u>Jellied products</u> will be judged on the basis of clear, natural color and typical flavor or sugar crystals and firm enough to hold shape, yet tender and quivery.

Butter will be judged on the following factors: does the butter jell, is it smooth, good color and not too thick.

Jams will be judged on the following factors: soft fruit and syrup of a good bright color, thick and of good consistency.

Conserves should be two or more fruits, cooked with sugar until thick.

<u>Marmalades</u> are soft fruit jellies, small pieces of fruit suspended in the trans- parent jelly, bright color.

<u>Preserves</u>: Fruit should be a natural color, transparent, plump and pieces of fruit should hold their shape; syrup should be thick and clear.
